Answer 2: The pap smear test has been replaced by the Cervical Screening Test, available to women aged 25-74 and is tested every 5 years. The cervical screening test detects HPV and checks the health of your cervix. You will be due for your first cervical screening test two years after your last Pap test. Speak to your doctor if you are overdue or unsure.

Answer 3: Breast cancer and gynaecological cancers which include cancers of the cervix, fallopian tubes, ovary, placenta, uterus, vagina and vulva.

Answer 4: Dark purple

Answer 5: Angelina Jolie

Answer 6: Changes to your breasts including lumps, lumpiness, a thickened area, a change in shape or unusual pain. Most changes are not due to breast cancer however it's important to have them checked straight away.

Answer 7: BreastScreen invites eligible women aged 50-74 for a free mammogram every two years. Women aged 40-49 or 75 and over may also be eligible.

Answer 8: Your medical professional for example GP.

Answer 9: At least one third of cancer cases are preventable through healthy lifestyle choices such as quitting smoking, being SunSmart, having a healthy diet, limiting alcohol consumption, and regular exercise.
